STANDARD TIME

QUARTZ MOUNTAIN rejoins the Oklahoma State Parks system with a renovated lodge, updated amenities, and a new lease on life. Pack your hiking shoes, your swimsuit, and your sunscreen, and get ready to get reacquainted with this beloved park.

LONG ANY HIGHWAY in southwestern Oklahoma near Altus, the land ebbs from the road in an expanse of pastures and croplands, a placid ocean of cotton fields, wheat, cattle, and horizon that seems infinite. As you cut farther south, though, rust-colored peaks gradually emerge from the hazy edge of sky. To an unfamiliar traveler, Quartz Mountain, a smaller outcropping of the Wichita Mountain range, must be a surprising development in this pastoral scene. The rugged granite boulders are an abrupt departure from the relative flatness that surrounds them, like they were haphazardly dropped by a giant who shrugged and then went on his way. It's no surprise, then, that these striking hills have been a landmark and gathering place for locals and travelers for generations.
